

January 8, 2021 - The Colorado Department of Revenue (DOR), in conjunction with the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE), is issuing a health and safety advisory due to the identification of potentially unsafe levels of Total Yeast and Mold on Retail Marijuana flower (bud/shake/trim) produced by Carrick-Harvest, LLC (DBA Veritas Fine Cannabis). The CDPHE and DOR deem it a threat to public health and safety when marijuana is found to have levels of Total Yeast and Mold above the acceptable limits established in Marijuana Enforcement Division (MED) Rule 4-115.

DOR has identified Harvest Batches of Retail Marijuana produced by Carrick-Harvest, LLC (DBA Veritas Fine Cannabis) that were confirmed to have failed contaminant testing. These Harvest Batches are listed below. The Harvest Batches were documented as having been produced on October 26, 2020 and October 31, 2020. Marijuana products derived from these Harvest Batches were sold in Retail Marijuana Stores between November 16, 2020 and December 16, 2020.

Consumers who have these affected products in their possession should return them to the Retail Marijuana Store from which they were purchased for proper disposal. Consumers who experience adverse health effects from consuming the product should seek medical attention immediately and report the event to the store from which they purchased the product.

All containers of affected marijuana should have a label affixed that, at a minimum, indicates the license number of the Retail Marijuana Business that cultivated the marijuana as well as the Harvest Batch number assigned to the marijuana. Consumers should check the label of their Retail Marijuana flower (bud/shake/trim) for the following license number and Harvest Batch numbers.
